Her previous roles include Senior UX Researcher at Verizon Connect Ireland Limited, Postdoctoral Research Fellow at University College Dublin, and R&D Analyst at Queen's University Belfast and the University of Aberdeen. She has published several papers in the fields of Human-Centred Artificial Intelligence, argumentation, and behaviour change.
